**ABSTRACT:** "Intellectual Property Crimes"

I propose a program focusing on Intellectual Property Crimes, which will examine the various federal criminal laws which can be brought to bare on those violating the intellectual property of others.

The presentation would involve a discussion:

- the Computer Fraud and Abuse Act;
- the Economic Espionage Act;
- the National Stolen Property Act;
- the Copyright Act;
- trafficking in counterfeit labels, illicit labels or counterfeit documentation or packaging;
- the Trade Secrets Act;
- criminal trademark violations;
- mail and wire fraud prosecutions;
- RICO;
- money laundering.
